

All Saints' Church Burial Policy

The following have the right to be buried in our churchyard:

- Parishioners
 - Persons dying in the parish
 - Persons whose names were on the Electoral Roll of the church at the time of their death
- The right of burial is not confined to members of the Church of England.
- A burial can take place without a service at all or after a service conducted by others elsewhere such as another denomination

Others, such as ex parishioners, those with family graves or those who have close relatives buried in the churchyard may be buried in the churchyard with the consent of the vicar, who shall have regard to the guidance of the churchwardens acting on behalf of the PCC.

This permission should be granted sparingly.

It is important to avoid giving the impression that permission will be given in return for a substantial payment

Interment of Ashes Policy

The same criteria apply for the interment of ashes as for the burial policy above.

Cremated remains must be buried and not scattered. The casket or urn should be made of a material which eventually decays in the ground.
